

Edworks is pleased to offer a scholarship information pack regarding the format, schools and timing of the ACER and EDUTEST scholarship exams, and SEAL/ELMS/ALPHA tests. Additional information can be gained by contacting the schools that your child wishes to sit for. Parents need to be aware that a number of the exams occur in February which often means that they fail to register on time and/or do not have sufficient time for preparation. Edworks therefore encourages parents to tell friends of the early exam times for future reference. **Outlined are the scholarship exams for 2024.**

1. The current companies are: **ACER, EDUTEST and AAS**. The format of the exams and schools, dates etc. are listed for your information. Please refer to their websites: <https://www.acer.org/au>, www.edutest.com.au and www.academicassessment.com.au for additional information with respect to online bookings.
2. **EDWORKS offers a FREE online scholarship preparation exam for students in Grades 6 to Year 9.** We also offer a percentile ranking so that students can compare their current level of performance. Students should remember that Edworks programs offer them the opportunity to make significant advances and gain greater confidence in preparing for scholarship exams. Our practice tests are designed to expose students to the style and format of the kinds of questions they will face in an entrance or scholarship examination. They are not designed to duplicate the level of difficulty of an actual scholarship examination.
3. Many other online practice exams are designed to show the students the general format, but are not at the appropriate level (i.e. too easy). As a result, students are surprised and unnerved when they sit the exam. EDWORKS provides suitably challenging exams that see students well prepared.
4. **All EDWORKS material and programs are in an exam format.** The added benefit is that we do not simply focus on the answer, but use the material as a tool to develop a student's skill set. An example is the development of our unique 4 Steps to Problem Solving.
5. All students sitting scholarship exams are encouraged to review the scholarship preparation booklets in their folders.

EDUTEST SCHOLARSHIP EXAMS

FORMAT INDICATIVE ONLY AND SUBJECT TO CHANGE

Scholarship and entrance exams are comprised of **Ability Tests** and **Achievement Tests**:

THE ABILITY TESTS

Ability tests are designed to **measure a child's ability to think, reason and solve** problems, without necessarily **relying on prior knowledge**. **Ability** generally **predicts** how **quickly a child** will be able to **learn** and the level of complexity they can **comfortably** deal with.

✓ **VERBAL REASONING**: measures the ability to think and reason using words and language. This includes vocabulary, word relationships, classification and deduction. (30 minutes in length)

✓ **NUMERICAL REASONING**: measures the ability to think and reason using numbers. This includes series, matrices, arithmetical reasoning and deduction. (30 minutes in length)

THE ABILITY TESTS

Ability tests are designed to measure actual achievement or performance in some key academic areas. Achievement scores are influenced by a child's ability, as well as the application and practice of knowledge that has been learned.

- ✓ **READING COMPREHENSION:** measures the capacity to read and interpret meaning from written passages, as well as correct, complete and punctuate sentences. (30 minutes in length.)
- ✓ **MATHEMATICS:** measures year-level appropriate mathematical knowledge, including number patterns, measurement, basic algebra, space and data. (30 minutes in length.)
- ✓ **WRITTEN EXPRESSION:** This is a writing test that assesses the ability to convey ideas clearly in written form. Any of the following modes of writing may be assessed: creative, descriptive, narrative, persuasive, expository or informative. Students will be assessed on a range of criteria, including: Relevance to the topic, accurate spelling, punctuation and grammar, proper sentence structure and paragraphing. (15 minutes in length.)

ACER PRIMARY SCHOOL TEST

FORMAT INDICATIVE ONLY AND SUBJECT TO CHANGE

Primary level tests (entry into Years 4, 5 or 6)

The format consists of:

✓ **READING & COMPREHENSION**. Time: 30 min.

Format: 25 multiple choice questions.

✓ **MATHEMATICS**. Time: 30 min.

Format: 20 Multiple choice questions.

✓ **WRITING**. Time: 40 min.

Format: 2 x short extended response essays of 20 minutes each, 40 minutes total.

ACER SECONDARY SCHOOL TEST

FORMAT INDICATIVE ONLY AND SUBJECT TO CHANGE

CSTP Test Structure: Level 1 = Grade 6, Level 2 = Yr 8, Level 3 = Year 9/10.

There will be a maximum of **four** separate tests.

Test 1: Written Expression (extended response, 25 minutes)

Two topics for writing will be set to allow students to use different styles of writing. They are presented as two separate tests (one in Test 1 and one in Test 4). This test is concerned with the student's ability to express thoughts and ideas in writing.

Test 2: Humanities – Comprehension and Interpretation (multiple choice, 40 minutes)

This test asks students to answer questions related to written and visual material. The material may be drawn from subject areas such as English, Art, History, Geography and Social Studies. No specialist knowledge in these areas is assumed – all the information needed will be provided. Students are required to think critically and make judgements about different types of texts, including fiction, non-fiction, poetry, cartoons, diagrams and maps.

Test 3: Mathematics (multiple choice, 40 minutes)

This test attempts to measure mathematical and scientific abilities rather than school achievement in these areas. The material used for the questions is selected from a wide variety of sources, and may differ from standard school-based curriculum materials.

Test 4: Written Expression (extended response, 25 minutes)

Two topics for writing will be set to allow students to use different styles of writing. They are presented as two separate tests (one in Test 1 and one in Test 4). This test is concerned with the student's ability to express thoughts and ideas in writing.

The actual time at which the first test starts can be determined by the school. A break should be allowed between Tests 2 and 3.

AAS TEST

FORMAT INDICATIVE ONLY AND SUBJECT TO CHANGE

Students sitting an AAS exam are assessed in the following areas:

Abstract Reasoning and Problem Solving: this test assesses the ability to reason with and analyse information using verbal, mathematical, figural and spatial concepts.

Mathematics Achievement and Reasoning: for primary and junior secondary students these tests assess curriculum-related mathematics tasks and mathematical reasoning tasks. Middle and senior secondary students are assessed on mathematics reasoning tasks. These are different to curriculum-based mathematics and focus on problem-solving skills.

Reading Comprehension: this test assesses the ability to remember, locate, analyse, evaluate, derive and combine text propositions with fiction and non-fiction texts of increasing complexity.

Written Expression: this test assesses students' facility with written language. A stimulus is provided for students to produce a piece of writing in a particular genre (e.g. narrative or argument) depending on the requirements of the School.

Each task is around 40- 45 minutes in length, except for Written Expression, which is 25 minutes.

These tasks measure how a child performs in relation to the cohort sitting the exam.

Students and parents need to be aware that these tests maybe demanding and that not all students will complete each test within the time allowed. It is important students do not spend too much time on questions they find too difficult.

SEAL/ELMS/ALPHA EXAMS

As with the scholarship and selective entrance exams, schools select from ACER (AUSTRALIAN COUNCIL OF EDUCATIONAL RESEARCH) and EDUTEST™. A few schools also take the option of writing their own tests or utilising educational consultants.

Edworks has been assisting students for over 30 years. We recommend that parents contact the school/s via their websites and then depending on the format, we can integrate issue based writing/abstract reasoning or not. The other aspects of the exams are similar to general scholarship/entrance exams. Edworks takes the initiative to prepare for a wide variety of formats.
